


Further local mediatic accents of English

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(with counseling by Maurizio Pugliese, May, 2021)


1. In addition to the Northern-English accent, recently posted, here are six additional ones. Four are American-English, and two are English-English ones. We will illustrate their vowel and intonation features, while the *consonantal* ones are not dealt with, since they alternate between their regional and neutral qualities, including true mediatice variants. All these are fully described in the corresponding chapters of our *English Pronunciation & Accents*.

fig 1. West-American mediatic accent.




2. The first local mediatic accent is the Western-American one, as shown in fig 1 (mainly based on San Francisco and Los Angeles). The second is the Southern-American (fig 2, more widely based on a number of important cities in the South).

fig 3. North-American mediatic accent.







fig 4. East-American mediatic accent.

fig 5. Mid-English mediatice accent.




fig 6. South-west-English mediatice accent.
